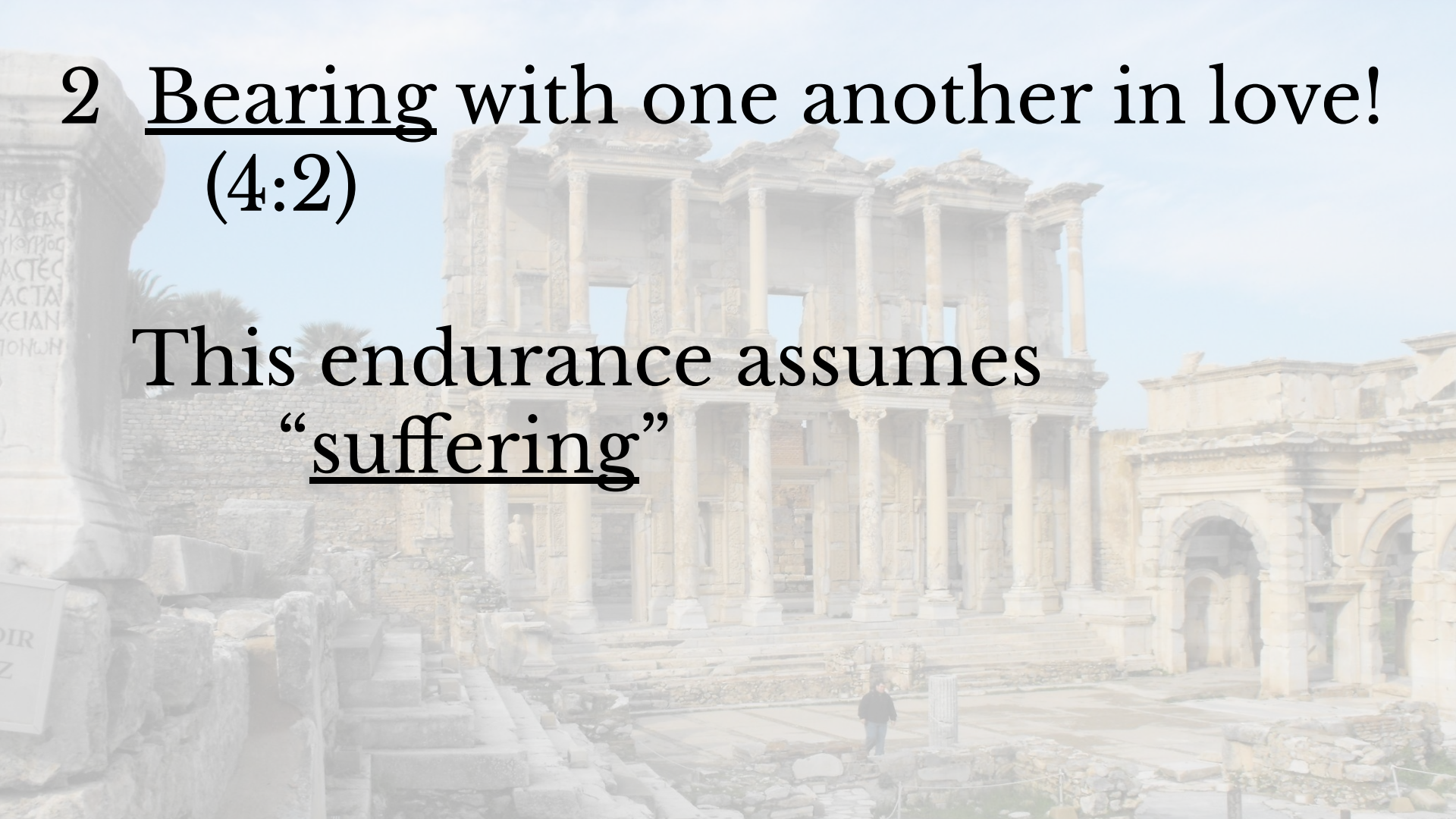
“WALK” is the main verb in the sentence; there are also two participles that help us understand *how* to walk in this way: “Bearing with” and “Being Diligent”
